

Little Jerusalem Badlands State Park

Little Jerusalem Badlands State Park provides a tremendous opportunity to connect people to the wonders of the prairie. It is a one-of-a-kind landscape in Kansas and the state's largest Niobrara Chalk formation.

The formations provide unique and important habitat for many plants and wildlife. Explore the trails to view the rock formations, some of which tower more than 100 feet above the nearby Smoky Hill River. Little Jerusalem is owned by The Nature Conservancy who partnered with the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks & Tourism to make portions of the area open to the public. Guided tours can be scheduled by calling 620-872-2061.

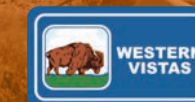
Western Vistas Historic Byway

TRAVELERS WITH A PIONEERING SPIRIT

Follow the 102-mile journey of the Byway to uncover the history of the last Indian Battle in Kansas, Battle Canyon. See what life was like at a U.S. Military Fort at Fort Wallace. Visitors can appreciate the struggles the early settlers endured. This is the land where buffalo roamed, and the Indians, the U.S. Cavalry and pioneers called home. This was a rugged land, but they all fought to survive and make it their own. Today, one can still find the majestic buffalo grazing on the short prairie grass north of Scott City, or see where the trail of the Butterfield Overland Despatch (BOD) passed through. There are several limestone markers along the route. Visit our many museums along the route and take in the beauty of the Monument Rocks which are one of the 8 Wonders of Kansas. Lake Scott State Park

Visit **Lake Scott State Park**! The park is a hidden oasis, full of rich history and beautiful scenery. One can enjoy boating, swimming, camping, hiking, hunting, and fishing. Visitors can also reserve one of two cabins. The park includes two historical sites. The Steele Home Museum and El Cuartejejo Pueblo Ruins.

The **Steele Home Museum** was the home of Herbert & Eliza Steele and has been preserved much as it was 100 years ago. The home is made of sandstone gathered from the surrounding bluffs. The Steeles wanted their homestead to become a public park and recreation area. This dream became a reality in 1928 when the Kansas Forestry, Fish and Game Commission acquired the 1,280 acres, which now is the Lake Scott State Park.

El Cuartejejo Pueblo Ruins are the 1664 reconstructed pueblo ruins of the Taos Indians, who were fleeing Spanish rule and later used by Picurie Indians in 1701. The ruins were discovered by Herbert Steele in the mid 1890's. In 1970, the Kansas Historical Society began extensive excavation & restoration and the present site allows visitors to see the pueblo's reconstructed foundation.

Explore the **El Cuartejejo Museum** as it leads the visitor through a developing story line, one which traces the history of this region of western Kansas through the stories told by the fossil discoveries on exhibit to present day Scott County information. The must see displays allow the visitor to take a glimpse of what life would have been like in the early Native American & Pioneer History. There are many exhibits that will stir your intellect and stimulate your imagination. From young children to their grandparents, there is something for everyone to enjoy.

Jerry Thomas Gallery & Collection



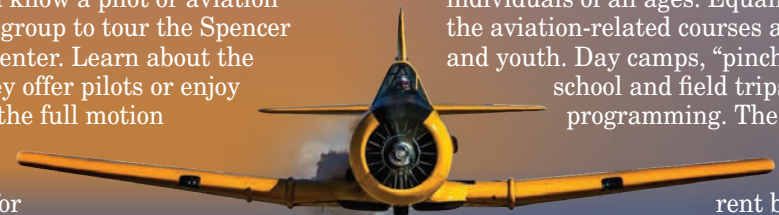

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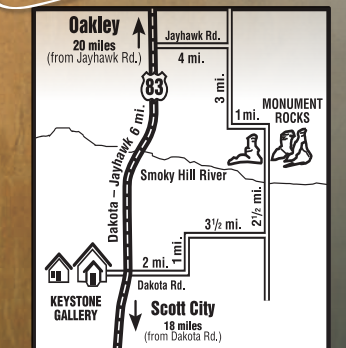

Keystone Gallery

Experience **Keystone Gallery** where you can view an extensive collection of local Kansas fossils including a 20' Mosasaur, 14' Xiphactinus and a 24' mural depicting the seaway that once covered the area. Monument Rocks

View the breath-taking **Monument Rocks**, also known as the Chalk Pyramids. The natural formations are 18 miles north of Scott City, then turn east at **Keystone Gallery**. This site is the



first National Natural Landmark in Kansas designated by the Department of Interior on October 31, 1968. These limestone formations stretch to 50 feet in height. Monument Rocks has also been chosen as one of the 8 Wonders of Kansas. The quiet beauty and scale of the Monument Rocks will be a lifetime memory.

Battle of Punished Woman's Fork

Travel to the place where the last Indian battle in Kansas was fought in September 27, 1878. **Punished Woman's Fork** is about one mile south of Lake Scott State Park. A monument overlooks the cave, canyon, and the bluffs where the Northern Cheyenne hid waiting to ambush the U.S. Cavalry. To this day, this historical site gives evidence of the fierce battle that took place, with the rifle pits the Cheyenne strategically positioned still visible on the hilltops.
